Rosa Parks Cause and Effect In 1955 in Montgomery, Alabama, Rosa Parks, an African American woman, refused to give up her seat for a white passenger That simple act landed her in jail and it also set in motion the Montgomery bus boycott It lasted for more than a year The city of Montgomery eventually lifted the law that
